A COMMITMENT TO RESEARCH

The majority of rare genetic diseases have no treatment. Symptoms can be managed, but the course of the diseases remains unchanged. NTSAD is committed to funding research and collaborating with investigators to work towards disease-modifying treatments. This commitment includes advancing clinical trial readiness in our diseases by supporting work on natural histories, biomarkers, and clinical endpoints. On an annual basis, NTSAD solicits proposals for basic research to clinical studies – all to generate findings that illuminate the pathway to treatment. NTSAD has made over 3.7 million Research Initiative grants in collaboration with family funders and partner organizations which have led to NIH grants of more than \$20 million toward finding a cure.



TAY-SACHS GENE THERAPY (TSGT) CONSORTIUM

The TSGT Consortium is one example of how NTSAD supports research. This important initiative was founded in 2007 specifically to advance human clinical trials in the quest for a gene therapy for Tay-Sachs and Sandhoff diseases. The consortium has completed pre-clinical milestones in preparing for clinical trial; the next stages include production of vectors, toxicology studies and preparing for FDA interactions and regulatory filings leading up to clinical trial. In parallel, research is on-going to develop next generation vectors and drug delivery methods. There are also gene therapy programs in GM1 and Canavan diseases.



AWARENESS AND PREVENTION

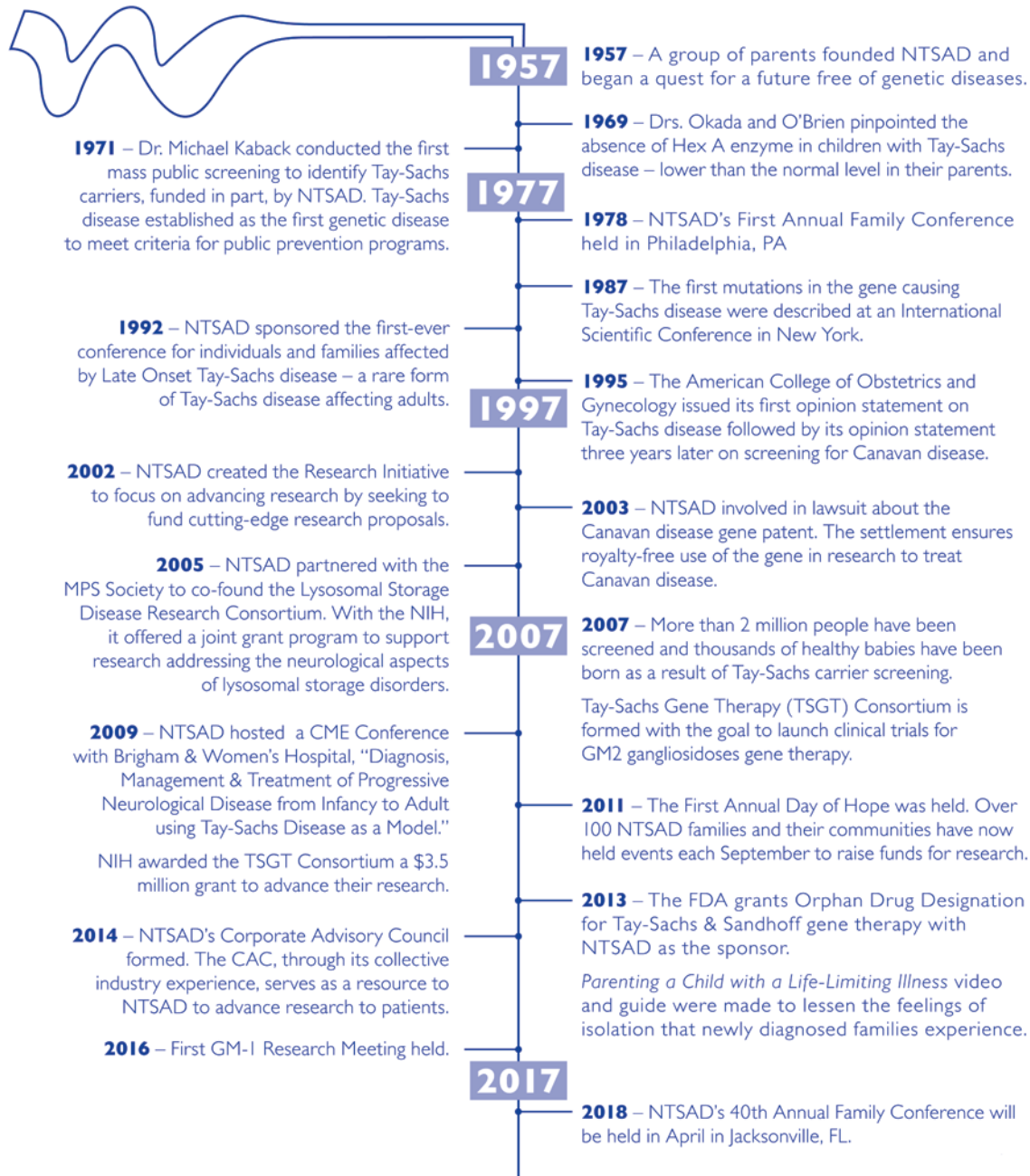
Anyone can be a carrier and it's important to know your risks. One in 250 of the general population is a carrier of the Tay-Sachs gene. One in 27 of those of Ashkenazi Jewish, French-Canadian or Cajun descent, and 1 in 50 to 1 in 190 who are Irish-American are at a higher risk for being carriers. We always recommend speaking with a genetic counselor to help you navigate these waters. Enzyme testing for Tay-Sachs is considered the gold standard. 2017 RESEARCH INITIATIVE GRANT AWARDS

NTSAD made four new research grant awards in 2017. NTSAD has now awarded 60 grants exceeding \$3.8 million since the inception of the Research Initiative in 2002. NTSAD's grant dollars have been leveraged to over \$20 million in NIH and other government or foundation grants.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

NEW FAMILY RESOURCES

The beginning of a new series of Care Tip videos were filmed at the 2017 Annual Family Conference to address issues and aspects of caring for a child at home. The first two are now available to newly diagnosed families of infantile and juvenile children, worldwide, through the NTSAD website with downloadable handouts. This series will serve as an invaluable resource to parents, caregivers, or nurses to show them how to resolve an issue, present a different approach to a common problem, or help them with the decision-making process.

Emma's Fund for Families was established to give families memory-making opportunities in honor of Emma Artinian. The purpose of the fund is to allow affected families to apply for grants to use towards enrichment activities. It can be used any way a family feels would be beneficial for creating their memories.

LATE ONSET NATURAL HISTORY

Together with clinician researchers and industry partners, adults affected with Late Onset Tay-Sachs or Late Onset Sandhoff participated in assessments for the third consecutive year at the 2017 Annual Family Conference. The purpose of the study is learn more about the disease so that clinical trials can be effectively designed in the future. This work, in concert with NTSAD-funded and NIH-funded natural history studies, will further pave the way for future clinical trials.



DAY OF HOPE

The Seventh Annual Day of Hope, which took place in September, was twice as big in participation and fundraising than any other year. Over 40 families raised close to \$90,000 for research exceeding our goal of \$60,000 in honor of NTSAD's 60th anniversary! NTSAD, its families, their friends and community worldwide have rallied and raised funds over \$300,000 since the first Day of Hope in 2011.

PATIENT INSIGHT NETWORKS (PIN)

Invitae's Patient Insight Networks (PIN) network, which began as PatientCrossroads, securely houses and safeguards aggregated patient data for more than 400 medical conditions, with a goal to collect and share data as broadly as possible to bring new and better treatments to patients faster. A PIN can build community and organize patients around the world. NTSAD is now collaborating with the following foundations on disease-specific PINs:

- Cure GM-1 Foundation on a newly launched GM-1 PIN
- Canavan Research Illinois and Canavan Foundation on the Canavan PIN announced earlier this year
- Cure Tay-Sachs Foundation on developing a GM2 (Tay-Sachs/Sandhoff) PIN

A FAMILY GATHERING

The NTSAD Annual Family Conference is the cornerstone of our exceptional Family Support Services. It provides parents, grandparents, affected children, healthy siblings, affected adults and their families the unique opportunity to:

- Gather with people that truly understand;
- Learn about latest research and symptom management approaches;
- Discuss other important topics.



CONFERENCE GOALS

The primary goals of the conference are to empower, support and connect families coping with Tay-Sachs, Canavan, GM-1 or Sandhoff. These diseases are always fatal in children and extremely debilitating in adults. The Annual Family Conference directly achieves our mission to support affected families and individuals in leading fuller lives.

HELPING HANDS PROGRAMS

Another important goal of the conference is to ensure every family is able to attend the conference especially those who cannot afford it. This goal is achieved through the Helping Hand Grant Program. Each year approximately \$40K is raised through donations and grants. Every dollar raised is awarded directly to families in-need to help cover the expense of attending. Scholarships range in size from covering one night at the hotel to covering hotel, registration and travel expenses for the entire family. Each grant application is considered on an individual basis and priority is given to newly diagnosed families, families that have not attended before, and families that have lost their loved one in the past year.



This Annual “Day of Hope” Event to Fund Research brings NTSAD families and their communities together for one day every September. From coast to coast, hope is shared through motorcycle rides, scavenger hunts, to hike, custom t-shirts and community gatherings.

It is imperative to keep hope alive by funding important research work that could potentially lead to an effective treatment for these rare diseases. Funds raised on these Days of Hope go directly to funding NTSAD’s Research Initiative.

NTSAD hopes to further the research to find a treatment and cure for Tay-Sachs disease with our Jacob Sheep Project. Tay-Sachs disease is present in the population of a rare breed of sheep called Jacob Sheep. The genetic makeup of these sheep is very similar to humans in the way that matters most for solving the mystery of Tay-Sachs disease. Funds must be raised to help care for the Jacob Sheep. There are now carrier sheep that are part of the Tay-Sachs Gene Therapy (TSGT) Consortium research project. Carrier Screening For Tay-Sachs & Allied Diseases

We are all carriers of recessive genetic diseases but standard healthcare practices do not screen everyone for all diseases because the technology does not yet exist to accurately and cost effectively screen everyone. Your doctor and/or genetic counselor can help determine, based on your family history and heritage, which diseases you are at risk to carry.

It is highly recommended to pursue carrier screening *before* pregnancy because the hormones can reduce the test accuracy and screening while pregnant limits reproductive options.

There two types of carrier screening tests: DNA and enzyme (biochemical). Tay-Sachs and Sandhoff carrier screening can be performed using DNA and enzyme testing. *A combination of both DNA and enzyme are recommended for the most accurate results.*

DNA (Molecular) Screening

DNA carrier screening detects specific known mutations that are "looked" for in the test. A negative DNA carrier result reduces the risk that you are a carrier, but does not eliminate your chances of being a carrier because of the possibility you carry an unknown mutation or one not "looked" for in the test.

Enzyme (Biochemical) Screening

Biochemical testing is also referred to as an enzyme assay. It detects the level of enzyme in the blood. Enzyme assays can be done using serum or leukocytes isolated from blood.

Serum testing is the standard test but leukocyte testing is recommended when the person being screened is pregnant, on birth control pills or taking any medications that affect hormones; all of these situations can potentially interfere with the accuracy of the serum test.

New Screening Guidelines Released By ACOG

Earlier this year the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) released expanded guidelines on carrier screening. ACOG, the specialty's professional membership organization, produces practice guidelines and other educational material for OB-GYNs. These new ACOG Opinions are significant for the genetics community because most practicing OB-GYN's apply these guidelines as the standards to follow in their medical practice.

The new ACOG Opinion, "Carrier Screening in the Age of Genomic Medicine," recognizes the critical role genetic screening plays in a successful pregnancy. Previous guidance from ACOG recommended genetic screening for particular disorders based primarily on ethnicity. For purposes of our organization, ACOG's previous focus was on specific ethnic populations with known increased risk for particular disorders, such as Ashkenazi Jews' increased risk to be carriers for Tay-Sachs and Canavan diseases. The new guidance broadens who should be screened and for what genetic disorders.

This opinion leaves it to the discretion of the provider to establish a method of screening, either pan ethnic, expanded carrier screening or ethnic specific, and to consistently apply it in practice. A *pan-ethnic* policy would mean that carrier screening for a panel of conditions is offered to all patients regardless of ethnicity. *Expanded Carrier Screening* is offered to all patients and utilizes the panels offered by laboratories where options range from 10 diseases to several hundred. The opinion also leaves it to the provider's discretion to choose the panel and number of diseases that works best for their practice, but it does offer guidance such as the severity and carrier rate.

ACOG Recommendations¹

- Ethnic-specific, panethnic, and expanded carrier screening are acceptable strategies for prepregnancy and prenatal carrier screening. Each obstetrician–gynecologist or other health care provider or practice should establish a standard approach that is consistently offered to and discussed with each patient, **ideally before pregnancy**. After counseling, a patient may decline any or all carrier screening.
- If a patient requests a screening strategy other than the one used by the obstetrician–gynecologist or other health care provider, the requested test should be made available to her after counseling on its limitations, benefits, and alternatives.
- All patients who are considering pregnancy or are already pregnant, regardless of screening strategy and ethnicity, should be offered carrier screening for cystic fibrosis and spinal muscular atrophy, as well as a complete blood count and screening for thalassemias and hemoglobinopathies. Fragile X premutation carrier screening is recommended for women with a family history of fragile X-related disorders or intellectual disability suggestive of fragile X syndrome, or women with a personal history of ovarian insufficiency. Additional screening also may be indicated based on family history or specific ethnicity.
- Couples with consanguinity (relation by blood) should be offered genetic counseling to discuss the increased risk of recessive conditions being expressed in their offspring and the limitations and benefits of carrier screening.
- Carrier screening will not identify all individuals who are at risk of the screened conditions. Patients should be counseled regarding residual risk with any test result.
- Prenatal carrier screening does not replace newborn screening, nor does newborn screening diminish the potential benefit of prenatal carrier screening.
- If a woman is found to be a carrier for a specific condition, her reproductive partner should be offered screening to provide accurate genetic counseling for the couple with regard to the risk of having an affected child. Additional genetic counseling should be provided to discuss the specific condition, residual risk, and options for prenatal testing.
- If a carrier couple (ie, both are carriers for the same condition) is identified before pregnancy, genetic counseling is encouraged so that reproductive options (eg, donor gametes, preimplantation genetic diagnosis, prenatal diagnosis) can be discussed.
- Individuals with a family history of a genetic disorder may benefit from the identification of the specific familial mutation or mutations rather than carrier screening. Knowledge of the specific familial mutation may allow for more specific and rapid prenatal diagnosis.
- Given the multitude of conditions that can be included in expanded carrier screening panels, the disorders selected for inclusion should meet several of the following consensus-determined criteria: have a carrier frequency of 1 in 100 or greater, have a well-defined phenotype, have a detrimental effect on quality of life, cause cognitive or physical impairment, require surgical or medical intervention, or have an onset early in life. Additionally, screened conditions should be able to be diagnosed prenatally and may afford opportunities for antenatal intervention to improve perinatal outcomes, changes to delivery management to optimize newborn and infant outcomes, and education of the parents about special care needs after birth.
- Carrier screening panels should not include conditions primarily associated with a disease of adult onset.

ACOG also released an Opinion titled “Carrier Screening for Genetic Conditions”:

“Carrier screening is a term used to describe genetic testing that is performed on an individual who does not have any overt phenotype for a genetic disorder but may have one variant allele within a gene(s) associated with a diagnosis. Information about carrier screening should be provided to every pregnant woman. Carrier screening and counseling ideally should be performed before pregnancy because this enables couples to learn about their reproductive risk and consider the most complete range of reproductive options. A patient may decline any or all screening. When an individual is found to be a carrier for a genetic condition, his or her relatives are at risk of carrying the same mutation. The patient should be encouraged to inform his or her relatives of the risk and the availability of carrier screening. If an individual is found to be a carrier for a specific condition, the patient’s reproductive partner should be offered testing in order to receive informed genetic counseling about potential reproductive outcomes. If both partners are found to be carriers of a genetic condition, genetic counseling should be offered.”

The opinion also recommends screening guidelines for specific conditions – Spinal Muscular Atrophy, Cystic Fibrosis, Hemoglobinopathies, Fragile X, Genetic Conditions in Individuals of Eastern and Central European Descent (Canavan disease is included in this panel) and Tay-Sachs disease.

So, what does this mean for Tay-Sachs Disease?²

- Screening for Tay–Sachs disease should be offered when considering pregnancy or during pregnancy if either member of a couple is of Ashkenazi Jewish, French–Canadian, or Cajun descent. Those with a family history consistent with Tay–Sachs disease also should be offered screening.
- When one member of a couple is at high risk (ie, of Ashkenazi Jewish, French–Canadian, or Cajun descent or has a family history consistent with Tay–Sachs disease) but the other partner is not, the high-risk partner should be offered screening. If the high-risk partner is found to be a carrier, the other partner also should be offered screening.
- Enzyme testing in pregnant women and women taking oral contraceptives should be performed using leukocyte testing because serum testing is associated with an increased false-positive rate in these populations
- If Tay–Sachs disease screening is performed as part of pan-ethnic expanded carrier screening, it is important to recognize the limitations of the mutations screened in detecting carriers in the general population. In the presence of a family history of Tay–Sachs disease, expanded carrier screening panels are not the best approach to screening unless the familial mutation is included on the panel.
- Referral to an obstetrician–gynecologist or other health care provider with genetics expertise may be helpful in instances of inconclusive enzyme testing results or in discussion of carrier testing of an individual with non-Ashkenazi Jewish ethnicity whose reproductive partner is a known carrier of Tay–Sachs disease.

The field of genetics continues to move at a rapid pace. Professional recommendations and the law often lag behind the scientific advances. Many of the new recommendations from the new opinions are welcome updates. However, some leave us concerned that not everyone who should be screened will be screened, especially concerning Tay-Sachs disease. The opinions also only recommend genetic counseling for certain patients with positive results.

As we reported in a previous IMPACT, the number of diseases on a panel is determined by the lab offering the test. OB-GYN's will most likely be picking the number of diseases based on the lab their practice uses or the lab the patient's insurer will cover. This will lead to a great deal of variation between practices across the country.

NTSAD-DV would like to offer the following guidance to the OB-GYN community as you put these new recommendations into practice:

1. Every patient should meet with a genetic counselor before and after undergoing genetic screening. Genetic counselors are an important part of the healthcare team. They work with patients and their families to help them understand genetic testing, guide them through the process, and help them make informed choices based on their individual genetic testing results;
2. Practices should select an expanded carrier screening panel and offer that panel pan-ethnically to their patients. Relying on patients to self-report ethnicity can be extremely unreliable and patients themselves are often unaware of their true ethnic heritage;
3. Practices should select a lab and panel that utilizes next generation sequencing. Next generation sequencing is a process that can look at entire sections of DNA at one time. The sequencing would likely pick up the mutations that were on the previous panels and many that were not, and thus would be more appropriate for a pan-ethnic population. However, as a general rule, the sequencing would provide individuals with more reassurance that they are not carriers when compared to the results of mutation panel screening. Due to the significant competition in genetics, many labs will work with physicians on pricing and establish a limit to the out of pocket cost to their patients regardless of insurance.
4. Tay-Sachs disease should be included on the panel and offered to all patients. Dr. Adele Schneider, Director Division of Medical Genetics, Einstein Medical Center in Philadelphia and Medical Director, Victor Center for Jewish Genetic Diseases, is a proponent of screening with sequencing panels: "Screening with sequencing panels will enhance the detection rate for Tay-Sachs disease especially where Hex A enzyme is not being done and only a few mutations are on the panel. While the definitive study to prove that sequencing for Tay-Sachs disease is as good as enzyme has not yet been done, it is possible that once we know this, Tay-Sachs testing will become reliable in all populations, not just the Ashkenazi Jewish population for whom the panel of mutations has been designed."
